

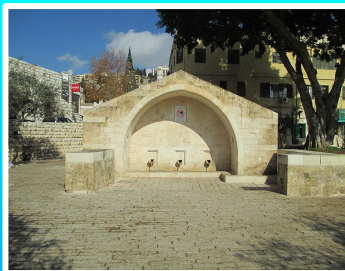

2. Nazareth is the largest city and Arab City in northern Israel because the inhabitants are predominantly Arab people of Israel!

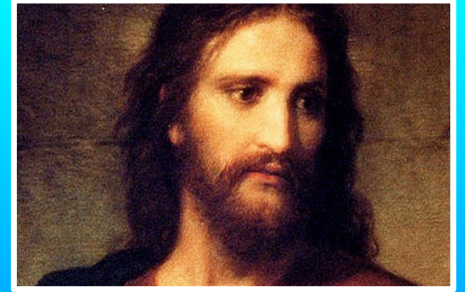

4. Nazareth declared their own separate city in June 1974! (Although the city is VERY old, it only became an official one 46 years ago.)

5. The name "Nazareth" means sanctified, crowned, or separated.

6. Nazareth was the birthplace of Jesus. Today, you can go to the place where he preached, and where he was buried.

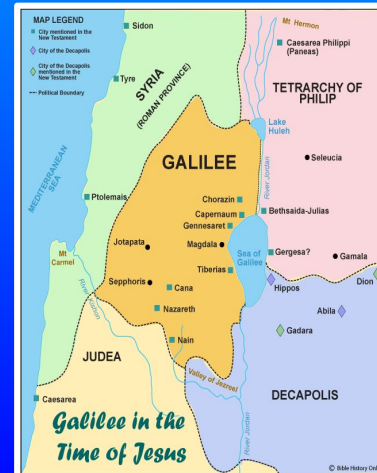
7. Nazareth is home to the biggest church in the middle east (The Basilica of the Catholic annunciation)



Why is Nazareth so significant in history?

Nazareth, Arabic an-Nāṣira, Hebrew Nazerat, is the historic city of lower Galilee in the north of Israel. According to [Britannica](#), Nazareth was where Jesus was raised. This is why many people come to visit Nazareth. It is said that many of the historic sights in Nazareth were once places that Jesus roamed. Nazareth had a Jewish population in Jesus' time; its Christian holy places are first mentioned after Christianity became the state religion of the Roman Empire (313 CE). When the Crusades was going on Nazareth was fought over constantly, when the king of sicily captured Galilee (Nazareth) in 1099, he declared himself prince of Galilee. When the crusaders were finally last expulsion from Palestine in 1291 Chrisitan Influence declined, and when the Ottoman Turks took over Palestine in the early 1600's and when they did the expelled all Chrisitians from the city. But only under the rule of Fakhr ad-Dīn II, emir of Lebanon who reigned (1590 - 1635), were Christinas were permitted to return to holy city. Christian-Arabs now form $\frac{1}{3}$ of Nazareth or 33.3333333333%. Modern Nazareth is the trade center for the Arabs living in Galilee. Tourism and manufacturing are also significant.

Animals of Nazareth

You may recognize most of these animals as farm animals but this is because back then the people of Nazareth depended on Animals to give them resources such as food, clothing, and more!

Sheep: 

Sheep have a significant role in life in Nazareth. Back then sheep were sometimes used as sacrifices. They are mainly used for their wool. The People of Nazareth don't eat meat if it isn't fish.

Goats: 

Goats were not used as food but in those times they were used to get milk; or for their fur. According to The Jesus Story, women tended the goats and sheeps, grew their fur/wool and cut it to use to spin clothing.

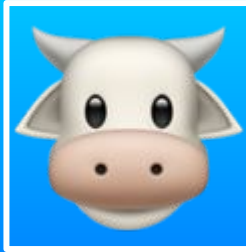
Cows: 

Cows back then weren't used as food. Since Nazareth at the time relied on agriculture, they used cows to plow the field.

Fish: 

The people of Nazareth rarely eat meat but if they are going to eat meat they eat salted fish!

Daily Life

Daily life in Nazareth consisted of working the land to pay taxes and feed families. Everyone pitched in to plant, tend, harvest and market crops of grapes, olives, wheat, barley and millet, and also raised animals such as hens, cows and goats. Women prepared the daily meals, in addition to many other domestic chores. The agricultural influences of the Nazarene culture are evident in many of the Bible's parables as taught by Jesus. The citizens of Nazareth spoke Aramaic, relying on storytelling and other oral traditions for both entertainment and education. with no modern conveniences commonly taken for granted today. Houses were cold and damp in the winter and the summer nights were so hot and humid that many slept on roofs tops. Today visitors to Israel can visit reconstructed villages at the Hasmonean Village, the Katzrin Talmudic Village, the Nazareth Village, and the Biblical Garden at Yad Hashmona, to get a glimpse of what ancient life was like. Great care has been taken at these living museums to present an authentic re-creation of daily life in the days of Jesus.

Famous People From Nazareth, Israel!!!

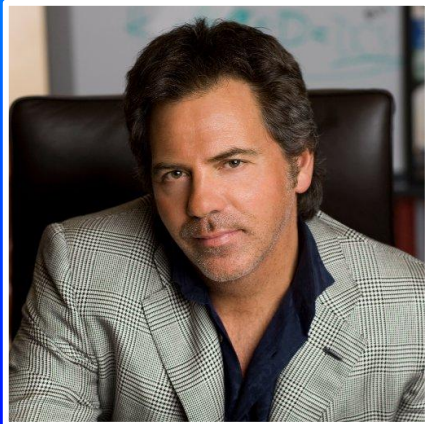

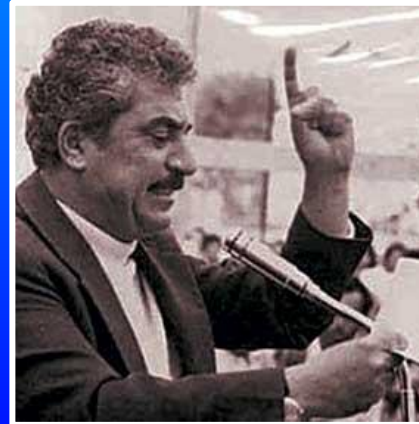


Palestinian Arab and an Israeli citizen who became the first Arab woman to be elected to the Israeli Parliament in 2009.

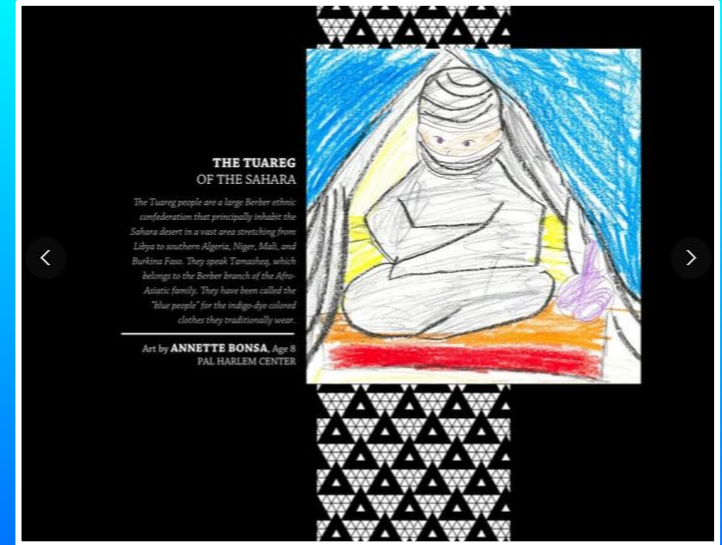
